

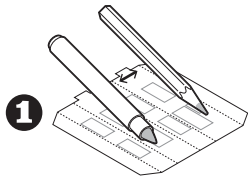
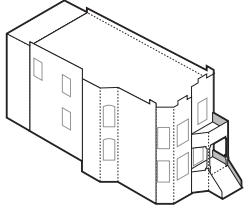

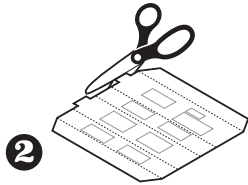
# Greystone

The Greystone is named after the distinctive grey-colored Indiana limestone used on the front of these buildings. The stone is easily carved into shapes and decorative ornaments, but over time hardens into a durable and long-lasting building material.

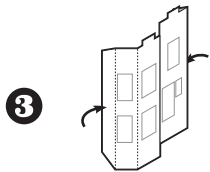
There are an estimated 30,000 greystone houses in Chicago, ranging from grand mansions lining the boulevards to the more-common greystone two-flat depicted here.



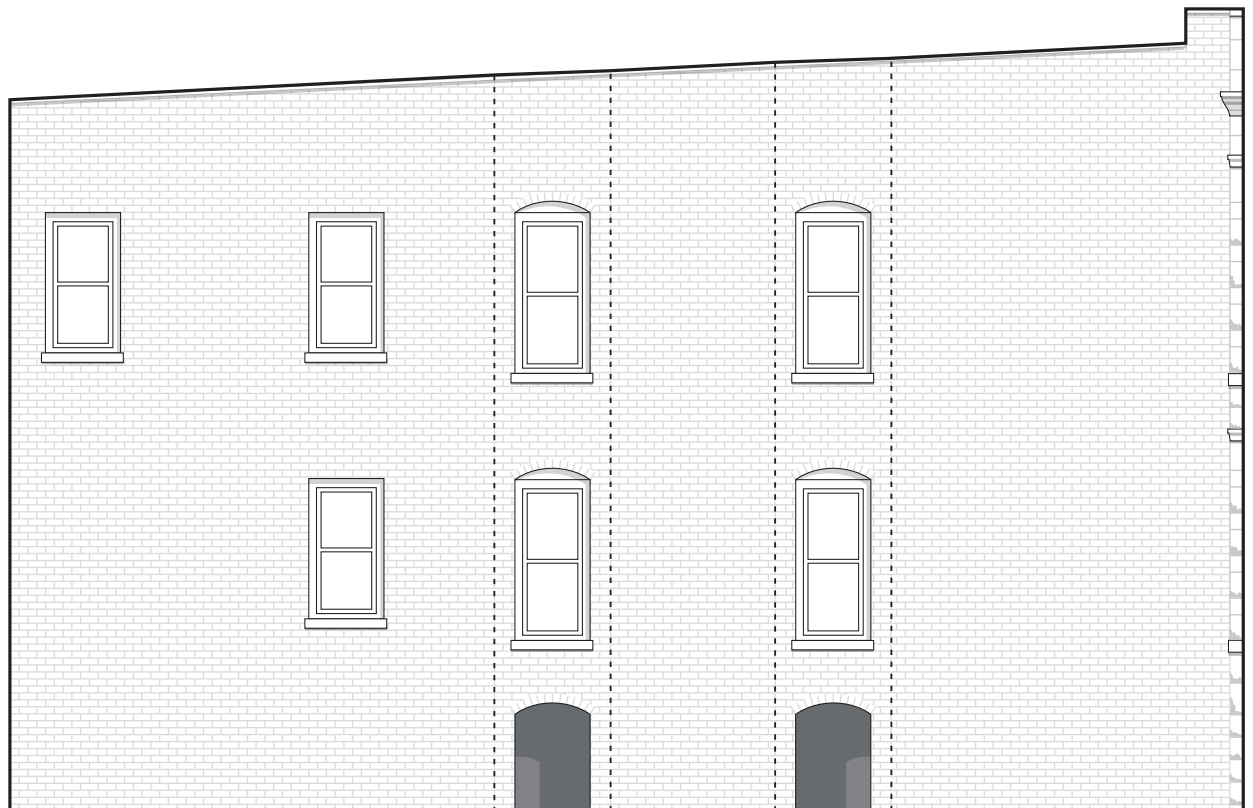

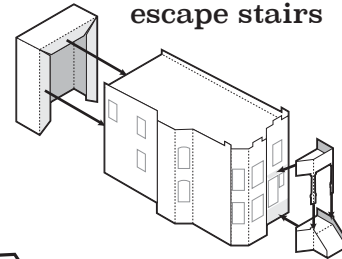


Balcony (optional)
